**Remembering His First Coming: The First Advent**

- **Began in the Garden**

**Genesis 3:15**

*And I will cause hostility between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring. He will strike your head, and you will strike his heel.”*

Then I saw thrones, and seated on them were those to whom the authority to judge was committed. Also I saw the souls of those who had been beheaded for the testimony of Jesus and for the word of God, and those who had not worshiped the beast or its image and had not received its mark on their foreheads or their hands. They came to life and reigned with Christ for a thousand years. <sup>5</sup> The rest of the dead did not come to life until the thousand years were ended. This is the first resurrection. <sup>6</sup> Blessed and holy is the one who shares in the first resurrection! Over such the second death has no power, but they will be priests of God and of Christ, and they will reign with him for a thousand years.

  - Christ Candle (White Candle – Christ's holiness and perfection): Center of the wreath. Jesus Christ is the Light of the World and we celebrate His birth today (lit on Christmas Day).

**NOTES:****What is an advent calendar? How does an advent calendar relate to Christmas?**

**The word ‘Advent’ has a Latin origin meaning ‘the coming,’ or more accurately, ‘coming toward.’** For Christian believers, Christmas is one of the greatest events in the yearly cycle, being **the celebration of the greatest gift ever given by God to mankind.** That gift was Jesus, the Son of God Himself, born into this world in human form and **coming to live among us to show us the true nature of God, experience human joy and sorrow along with us, and finally, going of His own will to die a horrible, agonizing death.** In this way the price was paid for all human sin that had cut us off from our Holy God and Heavenly Father, resulting in our complete and total reconciliation with Him.

Centuries ago, the importance of this event caused many Christians to feel that it was inadequate merely to mark off only one day on the yearly calendar for celebrating this incredible gift from God. **Believers had (and still do have) such a sense of awe and overwhelming gratitude and wonder at what happened that first Christmas that they felt the need for a period of preparation immediately beforehand.** They could then not only take time themselves to meditate on it, **but also teach their children the tremendous significance of Christmas.**

**At first, the days preceding Christmas were marked off from December 1 with chalk on believers’ doors. Then in Germany in the late 19th century the mother of a child named Gerhard Lang made her son an Advent Calendar comprised of 24 tiny sweets stuck onto cardboard.** Lang never forgot the excitement he felt when he was given his Advent calendar at the beginning of each December, and how it reminded him every day that the great celebration of the whole year was approaching ever nearer. As an adult he went into partnership with his friend Reichhold and opened a printing office. In 1908, they produced what is thought to be the first-ever printed Advent Calendar with a small colored picture for each day in Advent. Later on, at the beginning of the 20th century, they hit on the idea of making the pictures into little shuttered windows for the children to open day by day in order to heighten their sense of expectation.

The idea of the Advent Calendar caught on with other printing firms as the demand swiftly increased, and many versions were produced, some of which would have printed on them Bible verses appropriate to the Advent period. By now the Advent Calendar had gained international popularity, and children all over the world were clamoring for them as December approached. Unfortunately, the custom came to an end with the beginning of the First World War when cardboard was strictly rationed and only allowed to be used for purposes necessary to the war effort. However, in 1946, when rationing began to ease following the end of the Second World War, a printer named Richard Sellmer once again introduced the colorful little Advent Calendar, and again it was an immediate success.

Sadly, with the wane of Christianity in Western nations, the Advent Calendar, although still enormously popular with all children, has lost its true meaning. Many, many children and their parents have no idea of the history of the little calendar or its true purpose, which is to prepare us for the celebration of the advent of the Christ-child. Even if they do know, most would not care. Also, the makers of today’s Advent calendars are anxious only to sell their product, and the majority of these neither know nor care about the meaning and purpose of Advent. Their calendars depict Santa Claus and his reindeer, snowmen, holly, mistletoe, and all the secular trappings of Christmas behind the little windows, often along with a piece of chocolate. Fortunately, however, Christian printers are still with us to manufacture calendars for children from Christian families that unfold the story of the nativity with each window that is opened. We, as Christian believers, pray that one day the whole world will be aware of the incredible wonder of the true meaning of Advent and Christmas.<sup>1</sup>

### CHRISTMAS

#### A. The Cost Of:

- For Christian believers, Christmas is the celebration of the greatest gift ever given by God to mankind.
- That gift was Jesus, the Son of God Himself, born into this world in human form
- coming to live among us to show us the true nature of God,
- experience human joy and sorrow along with us, and finally,
- going of His own will to die a horrible, agonizing death.

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- **Atonement (washing):** The covering of our sin, the reconciliation between God and man.
- **Justification (just-as-if-I've-never-sinned):** The divine act whereby an infinitely holy God judicially declares a believing sinner to be righteous and acceptable before him because Christ has borne the sinner's sin on the cross. All this on the basis of faith and not works. (Romans 3:28-30, Galatians 2:16)
- **Reconciliation (restoring change):** The restoration to friendship and fellowship after estrangement. In the Old Testament we get the image of "covering" while in the New Testament it becomes to "change thoroughly." Someone is completely altered and adjusted to a required standard. Man is reconciled to God, not God to man.
- **Propitiation (paid-in-full):** The divine side of the work of Christ on the cross.
- **Expiation (no consequences demanded):** Denotes the end accomplished by certain divinely appointed sacrifices in respect to freeing the sinner from the punishment of his sins.

**B. Celebrating – A Response to the Cost:**

- The importance of this event + overwhelming gratitude and wonder at what happened that first Christmas that they felt the need for a period of preparation immediately beforehand.
- Time to meditate on it
- Teach their children the tremendous significance of Christmas.

**C. A Process to Follow:**

- At first, the days preceding Christmas were marked off from December 1 with chalk on believers' doors.
- Then in Germany in the late 19th century the mother of a child named Gerhard Lang made her son an Advent Calendar comprised of 24 tiny sweets stuck onto cardboard.

Lang never forgot the excitement he felt when he was given his Advent calendar at the beginning of each December, and how it reminded him every day that the great celebration of the whole year was approaching ever nearer. As an adult he went into partnership with his friend Reichhold and opened a printing office. In 1908, they produced what is thought to be the first-ever printed Advent Calendar with a small colored picture for each day in Advent. Later on, at the beginning of the 20th century, they hit on the idea of making the pictures into little shuttered windows for the children to open day by day in order to heighten their sense of expectation.

**MEDITATES.** (Ps. 1:2) *hagah* (hah-gah); Strong's #1897: To reflect; to moan, to mutter; to ponder; to make a quiet sound such as sighing; to meditate or contemplate something as one repeats the words. *Hagah* represents something quite unlike the English "meditation," which may be a mental exercise only. In Hebrew thought, to meditate upon the Scriptures is to quietly repeat them in a soft, droning sound, while utterly abandoning outside distractions. From this tradition comes a specialized type of Jewish prayer called "davening," that is, reciting texts, praying intense prayers, or getting lost in communion with God while bowing or rocking back and forth. Evidently this dynamic form of meditation-prayer goes back to David's time.

**MEDITATION—the practice of reflection or contemplation.** The word meditation or its verb form, *to meditate*, is found mainly in the Old Testament. The Hebrew words behind this concept mean "to murmur," "a murmuring," "sighing," or "moaning." This concept is reflected in Psalm 1:2, where the "blessed man" meditates on God's Law day and night. The psalmist also prayed that the meditation of his heart would be acceptable in God's sight (Ps. 19:14). Joshua was instructed to meditate on the Book of the Law for the purpose of obeying all that was written in it (Josh. 1:8).

The Greek word translated as meditate occurs only twice in the New Testament. In Luke 21:14 Jesus instructed His disciples not "to meditate beforehand" in answering their adversaries when the end of the age comes. The word may be understood in this passage as the idea of preparing a defense for a court appearance. Paul, in 1 Timothy 4:15, urged Timothy to meditate on, or take pains with, the instructions he gives. The idea of meditation is also found in Philippians 4:8 and Colossians 3:2.

Meditation is a lost art for many Christians, but the practice needs to be cultivated again. This form of meditation is not to be confused with either the cultish or oriental practices of mindless abandonment or focused mind control. This might better be described as "waiting on God" and "thinking on His Word or His love."<sup>2</sup>

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**ADVENT** Word with Latin roots, meaning "coming." Christians of earlier generations spoke of "the advent of our Lord" and of "His second advent."

- The first phrase refers to God's becoming incarnate in Jesus of Nazareth.
- The latter phrase speaks of Jesus' second coming.
- In a second sense "advent" designates a period before Christmas when Christians prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth. This practice may have begun in some churches as early as the late fourth century.
- **Advent began as a time of fasting.** Sermons focused on the wonder of the Incarnation. By the Middle Ages four Sundays had become the standard length of the Advent season. Since then, Advent has been considered to be the beginning of the church year. See *Church Year; Parousia; Second Coming*.<sup>3</sup>

## Eschatological and messianic emphases

### *Eschatological and messianic emphases in Zechariah 9–14*

This section of the book in particular has messianic implications. According to some commentators, “The messianic implications of Zechariah 9–11 focus on events surrounding Christ’s first advent. Zechariah 9:9 epitomizes this emphasis: ‘See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey.’ Chapters 12 to 14 encompass Christ’s second advent when he establishes the eternal kingdom of God. The theological climax of the Messiah’s arrival appears in **14:9: ‘The Lord will be king over the whole earth. On that day there will be one Lord, and his name the only name.’**” That is somewhat of an overstatement. Several passages in chapters 12 to 14 are quoted from or alluded to in the NT as applying to Christ’s first advent as well as his second. However, because chapter 14 in particular is clearly eschatological, those passages from chapter 14 that apply to Christ’s first advent probably are best seen as doing so because the two advents are connected: **the first inaugurated the kingdom; the second consummates the kingdom.**<sup>4</sup>

## V. THE FIRST ORACLE OR BURDEN, EMPHASIZING MESSIAH’S FIRST ADVENT (Chaps. 9–11)

The remaining chapters contain two oracles or burdens. The first, in chapters 9–11, emphasizes the First Advent of the Messiah, while the second one, chapters 12–14, looks forward to Christ’s glorious appearing.<sup>5</sup>

**Advent** (Lat., *adventus*, coming) 1. The coming of Jesus Christ. 2. In the Western Church, the season prior to Christmas honoring the birth of Christ, the traditional beginning of the ecclesiastical year. Advent begins with the Sunday nearest to St. Andrews Day on November 30. Four Sundays in Advent thus always precede Christmas. In the Eastern Church, Advent is a much longer season, beginning the middle of November. Originally, the sixth-century *Gelasian Sacramentary* called for five Sundays in Advent. Formerly, believers fasted during Lent, but the season is still **observed as a solemn time for preparation for the mystery of the Incarnation.** The season’s liturgical color is purple, except on Gaudete Sunday (or third Sunday), when it is rose.

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**Advent wreath** Circle of evergreen set with four candles, one of which is lighted every week of the season, beginning Advent Sunday.

**Adventism** Belief in the imminent and literal return of Jesus Christ to the earth. It is related to millenarianism and apocalypticism, and was widely held by the early Church Fathers including Polycarp, Ignatius, Papias, Hermas, and Justin Martyr. It was a key tenet of Montanism which predicted between 150 and 175 that a new age would begin with the descent of a heavenly Jerusalem near Papuza in Phrygia. The belief was dormant in the Middle Ages but was revived in the thirteenth century by Joachim of Fiore, in the fourteenth century by the Hussites, and in the nineteenth century by William Miller and the Seventh Day Adventi<sup>6</sup>
